The Fox-Wisconsin Heritage Parkway (www.heritageparkway.org) is working to achieve National Water Trail designation for the Upper and Lower Fox River and the Lower Wisconsin River, an important historic waterway stretching 280 miles from Green Bay to Portage and on to Prairie du Chien.

With this correspondence we are seeking written consent that acknowledges (1) we have contacted you, (2) you are aware we are seeking National Water Trail status, and (3) there are no objections. WE ARE NOT seeking funding of any kind, nor any restrictions on property rights.

To achieve this National Park Service designation, federal law requires that we seek written consent for all access points along the proposed Fox-Wisconsin Heritage Water Trail. (Said another way, Congress requested that consent be sought so no party is surprised when a trail receives national designation.) The proposed water trail would use one or more landings in your jurisdiction.

We also believe this effort will strengthen relationships with partners and communities and create additional publicity.
Therefore, we are respectfully requesting that you complete the attached Word document and return it to the email below, to the attention of Tom Young.

The access points at the Menasha Lock site are not owned by the city.



Per direction of the City Attorney, the Park Board will be the entity signing the consent form. Its next meeting is scheduled for September 10.
