When a child with a bee sting allergy is suspected of being stung:

- 1) Monitor the child for signs of respiratory distress.\*
- 2) Give Benadryl if available for child.
- 3) Notify parent. If unable to reach parent, notify emergency contact.
- 4) If signs of respiratory distress occur, give Epinephrine if available.
