



**PROCEDURE FOR CHILD WITH BEE STING ALLERGY**

When a child, with a known bee sting allergy, is stung by a bee:

1. Dial 911 for an ambulance to transport child to nearest hospital.
2. Notify parent. If unable to reach parent, notify emergency contact person.

3. Keep child quiet and apply cold compress to sting site.
4. Give EpiPen injection if child has breathing difficulty or a medical care facility is not in the immediate area.
