

We've worked hard to develop and maintain a vibrant downtown, a growing industrial and commercial base, and an effective and responsive municipal government. Today, we are introducing initiatives to redevelop Menasha's downtown and have developed programs to restore housing within older residential neighborhoods. To provide for our future economic growth, we've created a new business park and are working with developers on innovative plans for new residential communities.

In Menasha, electricity is provided to residential and commercial customers through a municipally owned utility, part of the Wisconsin Public Power System. Businesses and residents of Menasha are assured of low-cost, reliable electricity. Menasha also owns a citywide fiber optic system that provides high speed Internet access throughout the city.

Through partnering with local non-profit organizations, we have created the 52-acre Heckrodt Wetland Reserve, revitalized Curtis Reed Square and created an historic mural in downtown Menasha. Our municipal library has been renovated and expanded using public funding and private gifts.

The opportunities in Menasha for recreation, culture, education and economic growth are part of the quality of life the entire Fox Cities community enjoys.




A WEALTH OF Culture & Recreation

The arts, sporting attractions, and outdoor activities flourish in Menasha and the greater Fox River Valley. Our location offers residents easy access to year-long musical events and lecture series at Lawrence University, one of the finest private liberal arts colleges in the Midwest. For sports fans, the Green Bay Packers' newly renovated Lambeau field is within 35 miles. And, the Timber Rattlers baseball team, a Class A affiliate of the Seattle Mariners baseball team, plays throughout the summer at the Fox Cities Stadium in Appleton.

Menasha's library, the Elisha D. Smith Public Library, is well known for its children's programming and has undertaken a 17,000 square foot expansion.


For aviation enthusiasts, the Experimental Aircraft Association, EAA, located in Oshkosh, is a short fifteen-minute drive from Menasha. Each summer, EAA's Annual Fly-In brings aviation experts and hobbyists from around the world to our area. The organization maintains a comprehensive aviation museum, and conducts year round events. Professional music and theater productions from across the country appear at Appleton's Performing Arts Center, along with the Weidner Center and the Resch Center in Green Bay.

Cultural and recreational opportunities abound in Menasha and the greater Fox River Valley area.


Within our city boundaries, the Barlow Planetarium at UW-Fox Valley produces exceptional astronomy-related events throughout the year. The UW-Fox Valley campus also houses the Weis Earth Science Museum, whose mission is to depict and promote the geology of Wisconsin and its rich mining heritage. Heckrodt Wetland Reserve offers environmental education and activities for young and old.

Menasha and the Fox River Valley also offer outstanding outdoor recreation — hunting, fishing, biking, and boating. Menasha is located on the shores of Lake Winnebago, the Fox River and Little Lake Butte des Morts. Within a short distance, we have access to thousands of acres of open land and water where nature's beauty has so much to offer.




Menasha's strong economic foundation makes the City a great place to live and work. The paper and packaging industries are the cornerstones of the Fox Valley economy. Giants in the industry such as International Paper, Georgia-Pacific, Sonoco, and Menasha Corporation as well as companies such as SCA Tissue, Pechiney Plastic Packaging and George A. Whiting Paper all have plants in Menasha.

Of course, the paper industry is not the only industry in Menasha. Ranking among the Fortune 500 of largest industrial corporations since 1989, Banta Corporation is a provider of printing and digital imaging to publishers and direct marketers. The Fortune 500 company, Banta Corporation, was founded by Menasha resident George Banta in 1900. The company has diversified from printing into a variety of print technology related businesses. Other companies such as Kimberly-Clark, Sun Chemical, International Wire Works, and Albany International are also firmly established in Menasha.

Menasha's commercial base is broad and varied. The historic upper Main Street district features small shops and restaurants, the revitalized Curtis Reed Square and historical mural, and a bustling marina. Beyond Main

Street, Menasha offers sparkling commercial developments with grocery stores, restaurants and personal service businesses. A short drive away, over 1 million square feet of retail development at the Fox River Mall and surrounding areas offer extensive shopping opportunities.

A new business park is currently under development in one of the main commercial corridors of Menasha, offering easy highway access, low cost reliable electric service and high speed fiber optic Internet connections.


The Fox Cities area offers employment in manufacturing, healthcare, electronics, and consumer products. Within minutes of Menasha, companies such as Kimberly-Clark, Plexus, School Specialty and Appleton Papers house major facilities.

EXCELLENCE IN Education

Menasha residents benefit from excellent educational choices at every level — public and private, elementary, high school and post-secondary.

“Reaching for excellence,” is the credo of the Menasha School District. The district, which educates over 3,600 children, is composed of 5 elementary schools, Maplewood Middle School, and Menasha High School. The district is a pioneer in many ways, including the use of the Internet in many district classrooms, the teaching of Suzuki violin beginning in the second grade, and the availability of foreign language instruction from kindergarten through high school.



Students at Menasha High School may choose from a wide variety of courses in business, marketing, and computer-related subjects and must complete a minimum of 36 hours of community service before graduation. And, because Wisconsin offers inter-district open enrollment programs, parents may send children to the public school of their choice.

In addition to an excellent public school system, Menasha also offers four outstanding parochial schools providing quality education to grades K-8.

Menasha's belief in quality education shows in the quality of our schools and students.

High school graduates can stay right at home and attend UW-Fox Valley Center — a two-year campus that has begun offering a four-year program in engineering. UW-FV features small classes and individual attention where students can complete their general requirements before transferring to a four-year campus such as UW-Oshkosh or UW-Green Bay, both conveniently located in the Fox Valley. Alternatively, Fox Valley Technical College, an area technical college serving over 49,000 people in the Valley each year, and Lawrence University, a renowned private liberal arts university and conservatory of music, are both located a short distance away in Appleton.



EASY & CONVENIENT Transportation

Newcomers to the Fox Cities are always impressed with our transportation systems. A network of highways and well-maintained state and local roads means work, shopping and recreation are all within minutes of home. Citizens of Menasha enjoy hassle-free living, no traffic congestion and short commutes to work or school.

The main artery connecting the Fox Cities to Green Bay and Milwaukee is US Highway 41, which runs north/south and spans the Fox Cities. In 30 minutes, drivers on Highway 41 can reach Green Bay, and within 90 minutes can reach Milwaukee.

Access to the Fox Valley from Menasha is quick and convenient. State Highway 441, a cross town expressway, runs through the middle of Menasha, and connects our city with Appleton and all outlying areas within minutes.

Public transportation in Menasha is run by Valley Transit, which operates bus routes throughout the Fox Valley.



Air travel is a breeze, too. Business and vacation travelers in the Fox Cities use the Outagamie County Regional airport, which offers convenient connections to Cincinnati, Chicago and Milwaukee. American, United, Northwest and Midwest Airlines all operate from this airport. Private aircraft charter service through Maxair is also available at this convenient facility. Wittman Regional Airport in Oshkosh also offers a variety of flight options. Air travel here is easy, with no congestion, long lines or parking hassles.

In Menasha and the Fox Valley, the health and well-being of all citizens and their families is a top priority. We have a wealth of resources to support an outstanding quality of life.


Our health care systems are exceptional. Three major hospitals — St. Elizabeth's in Appleton, Appleton Medical Center in Appleton, and Theda Clark Medical Center in Neenah, are within minutes of Menasha. Theda Clark and St. Elizabeth's have recently expanded to include dedicated children's hospitals. Theda Clark, located in Neenah, has been recognized as one of the top 100 Hospitals in the United States. Theda Clark operates a Level II Trauma Center, assuring residents of sophisticated emergency treatment, and ThedaStar, a state of the art helicopter ambulance service.

The Fox Valley's major healthcare systems, ThedaCare™ and Affinity Health, operate these hospitals, as well as clinic locations and physician groups. In Menasha, Affinity has a day surgery center for convenient outpatient surgical procedures. Every citizen of Menasha is within minutes of a high quality medical specialist or healthcare center. The City of Menasha also has its own Public Health Department to promote public health and offer needed immunizations for children.



CLOSE TO THE BEST OF the Midwest

Menasha's location is ideal for access to exciting Midwest business or pleasure destinations.

Milwaukee, called The Genuine American City, is located 90 minutes away. The Milwaukee Brewers baseball team plays in the newly constructed Miller Park. And the City's newest expansion to its Art Museum, called the Santiago Calatrava expansion, brings a wealth of art and culture to Milwaukee visitors. Milwaukee is well known for its ethnic and cultural festivals held throughout the summer. The largest of these, Summerfest, brings musical attractions and ethnic foods from around the world to the city.

Madison, the home of the largest campus of the University of Wisconsin system, is a 90 minute drive from Menasha. Madison is located between two lakes, is an ideal spot for canoeing, and has been named one of the 10 best cities for bicycling in the United States. Over 40,000 students call Madison home during the academic year, and this lively environment makes Madison a favorite spot for many.

The best attractions of the Midwest are just a short distance from Menasha.

The Twin Cities of Minneapolis and St. Paul are a 5 hour scenic drive across the state. Wisconsin residents enjoy the Twin Cities as a getaway location. Visitors enjoy the renowned system of lakes and rivers here. Thrilling professional sports including the Minnesota Twins baseball team and the Timberwolves basketball team play in comfortable indoor stadiums.

Chicago is a short three hour drive from Menasha. This world class city offers visitors a wide selection of fine restaurants, theater and shopping. The Chicago Symphony, the Chicago Art Institute, the recreation and children's activities at Navy Pier, and the impeccable Michigan Avenue shopping district all beckon visitors from around the world.
