SEX OFFENDER COMMUNITY NOTIFICATION AND EDUCATION MEETING

Purpose of the meeting: To provide residents information regarding the release into your neighborhood of DWIGHT L. CHOUINARD a convicted sex offender. The purpose of the meeting is to provide information and education to the citizens in the Cities of Menasha and Neenah about this sex offender and make the public aware of the Wisconsin Sex Offender Registry Website.

Wisconsin State Statute 301.45, the Sex Offender Registration and Community Notification Law, designed to enhance public safety and protection, took effect June 1, 1997. The Sex Offender Information Bulletin is not intended to create fear or panic in the neighborhood. It is intended to increase awareness, and to emphasize the need to practice protective behaviors with your children. The purpose of the community meeting is to provide you with information and education. At the community meeting, members of the Department of Corrections, and the Menasha Police Department will provide the following information regarding:

- Sex Offender Registry and Notification Law
- Sex offender dynamics
- The subject named in the bulletin
- The supervision plan
- Offense pattern and rules of supervision for the subject named in the bulletin
- How to protect your children from sex offenders and how to discuss protective behaviors with your children

- The Menasha Police Departments response plan and crime prevention programs.

The purpose of the bulletin and the community notification meeting is **NOT** to harass or to further punish the offender, nor hamper the offender's chance of reintegration into the community. The bulletin and the community notification meeting are also **NOT** intended to further traumatize the offender's victims.

The subject identified in the Sex Offender Information Bulletin will be released from secure custody on January 21, 2010, having served the term of incarceration prescribed by the sentencing judge. Because of the nature of his convictions, the offender does have a reduced expectation of privacy. He has, however, the same civil and constitutional rights as other citizens of the State of Wisconsin. The Menasha Police Department will not tolerate threats, harassment or acts of vigilantism against the offender, his family or his residence.
