Department Updates:

- Building Update: We believe we have someone to take down the radio tower. We are working on an issue with fiber optic lines coming into the building. The general contractor did a walkthrough of the site to finalize the bid package.
- Staffing/Hiring Process Update: Officer Adam Schultz and Officer Randy Hill are continuing in Step V – solo patrol. Cadet Officer Shelby Patterson is currently in recruit school and is expected to graduate in May. A conditional offer has been given to a candidate for the final opening. We anticipate a mid-May start date after the final phases of the hiring process are completed. This would fill the final opening; however we are expecting a retirement in early June.
- A new parking ticket system is in the final stages of approval and should be implemented by the end of 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter.
- The new Livescan fingerprint system is up and running.
- We are hoping to complete a mock assessment for Accreditation in late May. This is an informal assessment of level of preparedness for our onsite review which is scheduled for November 2017.
- Police Week is May 14-20. We are working on the events for the week which include both officer and citizen awards as well as new employee recognition at the Common Council meeting and the awards dinner.
- The Department is switching to a new body video camera. This will put all patrol officers and supervisors on the same platform.
- Introduction to the new officer training program presented by Officer Tony Edwards: PTO (Police Training Officer).
